Professor James Arvanitakis

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Professor James Arvanitakis researches in the transdisciplinary areas of globalisation, citizenship, young people, security and the cultural commons - incorporating issues around hope, trust, safety and intellect. Having held various positions within human rights-based organisations including AID/WATCH and Oxfam Hong Kong, his research seeks to maintain a particular focus on issues of social justice. He has also worked with playwrights and artists to document stories of injustice such as the production of Maralinga which records the stories of nuclear veterans.



He is the author of *Contemporary society: a sociological analysis of everyday life* (Oxford University Press, 2009) and co-editor of *Piracy: leakages from modernity* (Litwin Books, 2014) and *The citizen in the 21st century* (Inter-Disciplinary Press, 2013).

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Dr James Arvanitakis named 2012 Prime Minister's Australian University Teacher of the Year

Dr James Arvanitakis from the University of Western Sydney has been announced as the 2012 Prime Minister's Australian University Teacher of the Year. The award was presented to DrArvanitakis at a ceremony in Canberra on 19 November.

Dr James Arvanitakis is an academic/activist in the humanities with over ten years experience. His philosophy of teaching is based on three pillars: working with students as agents for change (rather than 'citizens in waiting'), bringing theory to life and promoting a sense of agency and active citizenship. This is achieved through strategies such as *developing innovative teaching materials (including a text book commissioned by Oxford University Press), summarising key theoretical concepts in YouTube videos, to developing programs that bring together students and non-government organisations to promote active citizenship.*

Over the last three years James has concentrated on two areas: enhancing the first year experience and working with some of the University's most gifted students as Academic Course Adviser Bachelor of Arts (Dean's Scholars). This has included working closely with many first year students who are the first family members to attend university, come from low socioeconomic households and have ethnically diverse backgrounds. Within this context, James has developed a number of innovative techniques and approaches to both engage and assist 'at risk' students through difficult times. Student feedback surveys, various awards and many speaking and writing requests associated with teaching confirm the innovative nature and success of James' approach.
