Knowledge Network Institute of Thailand (KNIT) was established as a non-profit institute on 7th January 2003, with the endorsement of the Thai Cabinet.

Its mission is to provide an academic support to the government and social sectors by taking the initiative of new research policies corresponding to economic and social development plans of the country.

Also, to assist in providing both short-term and long-term academic policy recommendations and research-based framework for university development and education standards supported by networks of scholars from both national and international academic institutions under the supervision of its executive committee.
